As a member you will have free access to the Blacktown and District Historical Society Research Centre and meeting rooms.

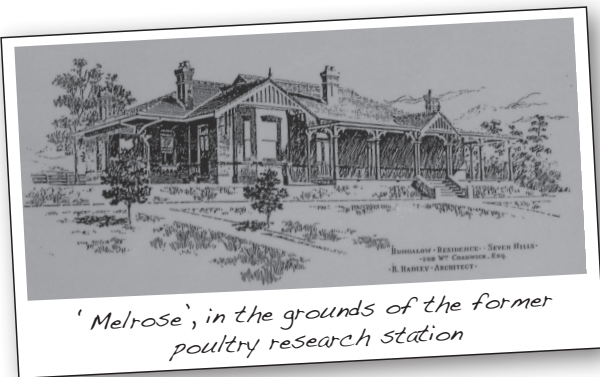
The Research Centre is open Tuesday 10.00am to 2.00pm or by appointment.

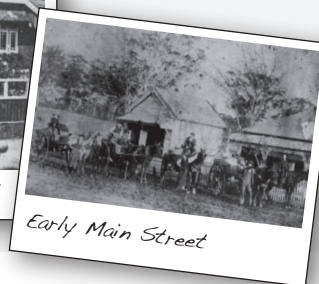

Blacktown and District Historical Society was founded in 1976, to ensure that the history of the Blacktown area would be collected and conserved for all time by tapping into documents and people's memories.

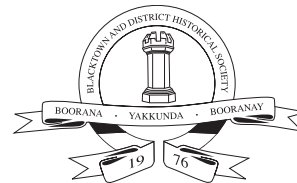
So many events in our local and national history occurred in this area and these must not be forgotten.

The department of Agriculture bought 58 acres (26ha) in 1923 to research many aspects of the poultry industry and Seven Hills was seen as the centre for pioneering poultry production around Sydney.
